Under Construction

Happy New Year! A new church year arrived last Sunday with the beginning of Advent, that time of



year we pay special attention to the nativity story, that season where we prepare for the coming of the Lord -- both at the end of time, when Jesus returns in all his glory, and when God became man and lived among us. And, at a new year, we often make resolutions, determining to develop more disciplined habits, determining to make changes for self improvement, such as exercising more or eating in more balanced ways. And, while these resolutions are worthy goals -- I have some other resolutions I'd like to challenge you to make, new resolutions for the Christian year. Here are a few of my goals:

First, please join me in remembering -- and sharing with your family what Christmas is all about. (Hint, it isn't about getting presents, shopping, materialism, and greed.) Please remember the story -- God became flesh and lived with us. Read the wonderful story again: "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2:11). Resolve to make Christmas about Jesus.

Second, refuse to get sucked into the mania often associated with Christmas -- excessive, expensive, and extravagant gift giving. Make sure your children know that the Bible is true and that it really is more blessed to give than to receive. Teach children to be generous with those less fortunate. Teach children, and model this yourselves, to be content with what you have.

Third. please pray this year -- pray for Haiti, for QCS, for teachers, for students. Regularly thank God for sending a savior.

Last, read the Bible. Share it with your family. Retell the wonderful stories and delve into the tough spots. Follow Jesus by learning more about his truth. And share that truth!

### Educational Tip of the Week

"Make sure your Child Knows Multiplication Facts by Fourth Grade"

Drill and repetition are the best ways to help your child learn multiplication facts. The good news is that there are dozens of opportunities during the week to practice and there are many ways of doing it.

Flash cards do work. You can make your own by cutting three-by-five-inch index cards in half and writing one fact on each card. Use the cards whenever you have spare time at home. You can also practice in the car by calling out facts, or by asking your child to recite answers to the times tables: 4, 8, 12, 16, 20, 24, 28, 32, 36, 40, 44, 48. Whenever possible, keep it light - make it into a game. Learning is easy when it's fun.
